4-H Country Ham Participants

4-H Country Ham project is part of the 4-H Animal Science program or 4-H Livestock program in Kentucky 4-H. It is also one of the projects Kentucky 4-H designates as a "certified project" which means that a required minimal amount of education hours must be completed before a member can compete in the events and contests offered in the project. A minimum of six educational hours must be attained by June 1, 2025. Attendance at monthly livestock club meetings is the way to earn educational hours.
